SCOPE & ANNOUNCEMENT

Enhancing plant productivity and ecosystem services in a challenging environment becomes a global issue in the millennium. As health awareness among the society increases, assurance of the quality in plant products and ecosystem services will be more crucial. The best practices in plant management will determine the level of plant production in a challenging environment.

Impacts of the changing environment have been widely reported. With a strong congregation of a multitude of professionals in the field of plant science, it is hoped that this conference will act as a platform to discuss the strategies for enhancing productivity and increasing quality of plants in a changing environment.

CALL FOR PAPERS

Papers of relevant topics within the conference themes are invited for oral/poster presentations. Authors must send their completed registration forms with titles of the papers and abstracts before 26 June 2009. The abstract must not exceed 500-words. Full paper not exceeding four pages of both hard and soft copy must be submitted to the organizing committee before 25 July 2009. Paper should include title, author(s), introduction, materials and methods, result and discussion. conclusion and references. Manuscripts should be prepared on A4 size paper typed single-spacing using standard 11 points Times New Roman in Microsoft Word 2003 (preferred) with 2.5 cm margin at top, bottom and both sides. All hard copies must be camera ready. The committee reserves the right for final decision for oral or poster presentation. Suitable papers will be invited for publication in the Journal of Tropical Plant Physiology, the official journal of the MSPP. The size for poster presentation is 50 cm x 80 cm, containing similar contents as oral paper, with font size of at least 28. Best poster presentation will be awarded.
